## AIMS AND SCOPE

The *Journal of Health Economics* seeks articles especially related to the economics of health and medical care. It seeks to fill a perceived gap between health services research journals and general economics journals. This gap has left economists working on health economics without a

satisfactory outlet for journal-length articles and those with an interest in their results without easy access to them.

Articles with implications for policy and capable of being understood by researchers in neighboring disciplines are sought, as well as technical pieces directed more specifically at professional economists. The less technical articles must, however, be founded on clearly enunciated economic principles. The scope includes the following topics: production of health and health services; demand and utilization of health services; measurement of health; behavioral models of demanders and suppliers; finance of health care, developed and less-developed country health; cost-benefit and cost-effectiveness analyses; geographic and other aspects of equity; manpower planning and forecasting; and public expenditure aspects of health policy.
